11:20 - 12:05 5 min 25 min 15 min	2022 Wins + New and Standing Investments in Youth Development <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Overview of material info • Table Discussion <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Confirm accuracy + additions ○ Recommend end funding priorities ○ Name key audiences • Summary Report Out 	Monique Robinson, Cafe Reconcile	Review, Discuss, Feedback	<p>Monique Robinson gave a brief overview on the materials at each table, and the points for table discussion.</p> <p>Karen Evans, CYPB Executive Director led the group in a full-room discussion based on what stood out from each table's review of the materials.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Berre Burch, Children's Bureau: One thing that would be good to see across investment detail is, what are total investments from one year to the next. Are we seeing an increase? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Jack Shaevitz, OYF: Yes. The 2020 Fiscal Map showed a \$40 million investment in children and youth. 2022 Youth Spend tool shows \$53 million. We project to see it jump to \$80-\$100 million with the new investments and millage. ○ Asya Howlette, OYF: The big jump in investment is from one-time funding. We need to continue to advocate for the things that need to be funded in the next cycle, and to figure out how to make them continued investments. • Melanie Richardson, TrainingGrounds: How are we making space for new /not traditionally funded programs to receive these funds? Is there intentionality around how we do that? • Aaron Clark-Rizzio, LCCR: We need more information around where the money is going, and how it's being spent. (ie., what software is JJIC using? Is that publicly available data? NoPD "juvenile intake" is on the list for youth investments, but it is out of alignment with the Youth Master Plan and not FOR youth.) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Identified need to disaggregate the data around developmental stage and how the money gets spent. ○ Identified need for a public advocacy push to ask for Court, JJIC, and NOPD data. The story around our young people is built and perpetuated on the lack of data. • Monique Robinson, Cafe Reconcile: Nothing in this budget is dedicated to support collaboratives and cross-sectors in



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				<p>building a usable data infrastructure. Additionally, upskilling around tools like RBA, ETO, etc.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Clarification stated that MHSD is not included in the investments breakdown because it is a state-funded entity. Michele Seymour, NOYA: Identified need for workforce development data, and shared data across organizations to identify service and needs overlaps. Berre Burch, Children’s Bureau - If there were more touch points around youth and shared data across organizations/systems that youth are likely interacting with at once, we would know who were at greater risk/what needs are.

Bridging the gap between passion and action, and keeping our young people active in working with young people.</p> <p>Sofia, gave an update on the Youth Master Plan Youth Voice Working Group 2022 progress and vision for 2023. She shared out details on the youth-led podcast in the making to launch early 2023. Sex-ed is one of their first topics; planning to bring in youth educated and others experts in that space to discuss. Another member of the group is focusing on the importance of sports and gaming.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Brittany Durham, IWES has program that features sex educators that can connect into the project. Louisiana Youth for Health Justice, IWES, was named as another possible connection for the project. Ahmaad Lott, NOYA, offered to share own skills and resources in media production. Larry Barabaino, Jr, NORDC, uplifted an emerging podcasting program and space to be housed within NORDC (Rosenwald) and connected into the work of NORD Teen Council and Chevron Future Leaders. <p>Karen Evans, CYPB Executive Director, acknowledged and thanked the Youth Advisory Board, noting that they are a sample of the greatness of the youth across the city.</p>

Each table shared one 2022 priority result score that was the primary focus of their table discussion:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Aaron Clark-Rizzio, LCCR - Need to work on promoting and marketing the YMP. If leaders adopt and consistently talk about the plan, we can promote systemic change through awareness by implementation. Teddy McGlynn-Wright, Coalition for Compassionate Schools - Can work on making Clear Impact more accessible, creating accountability across systems through deeper collaboration. X. Patrice Wright, Children’s Hospital - Can work on common and shared language when talking about healing opportunities for youth (ie., which youth?) and to identify what is needed and where are the gaps in this area. Daisy Reyes Cabral, IWES - Regarding healing opportunities, how can we be more inclusive of other cultures as New Orleans is a diverse city, continually growing. Need for more acknowledgement of the growing population of migrant youth and their needs.
